<p>REVIEW</p> 	<p>As the content for A Level Media is all new, the best way to prepare is to pursue your interest in the Media by reading, watching, and listening to different aspects. The resources and tasks provided will support you with this.</p>
<p>READ</p> 	<p>Start reading newspapers and news online regularly, noting which institution is providing your news (Guardian, Daily Mail, BBC...)</p> <p>Use the BBC news website to compare the front covers of all the British newspapers: https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/topics/cpml2v678pxt</p> <p>Notice how differently each newspaper reports the same stories. Ask yourself why this might be.</p>
<p>WATCH/LISTEN</p> 	<p>Successful students of media need to take an ongoing interest in the media. To deepen your understanding...</p> <p>Explore podcasts: Listen to this podcast, https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/m001k0x7. As you listen, consider how podcasts differ from a scheduled radio programme.</p> <p>One set text you will study is 'Black Mirror'. To familiarise yourself with Charlie Brooker's work, watch Season 3 Episode 1 'Nosedive'. Note this is on Netflix- if you have an issue with this, contact inghamn@fulford.york.sch.uk for an alternative task.</p>
